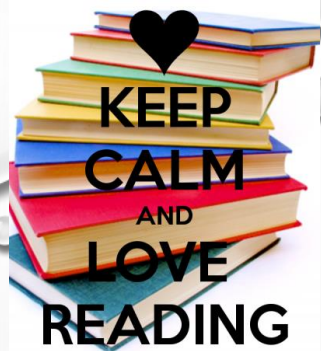

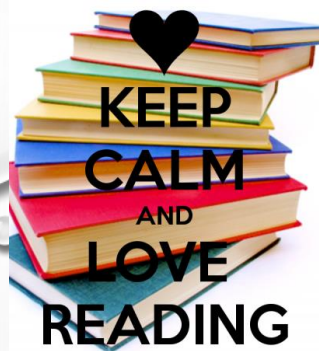

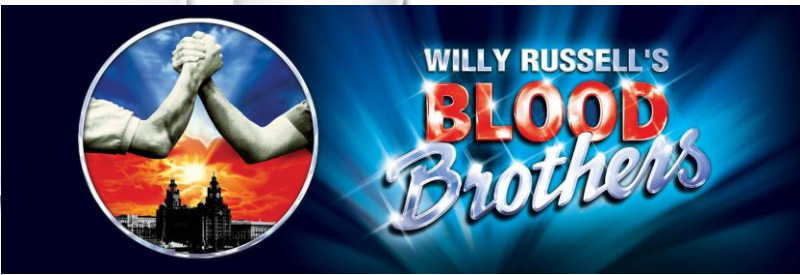

➔ **I**magery

➔ **M**eanings

➔ **E**njambment and Caesura

➔ **R**hyme

- Are the words positive or negative?

- Are any language devices being used? (e.g. Metaphor, simile etc)

- Are any colours being used?

- Are there any key words which link to the theme from the question?

- Is it 1st or 3rd person?

- Is there any Enjambment or Caesura?

- Does it Rhyme?
